Ana Grondona works as a researcher at the National Council of Scientific and Technological Research (CONICET) in Argentina. Also, she teaches social theory at the University of Buenos Aires (UBA) and is a member of the Centro Cultural de la Cooperación Floreal Gorini (CCC), dedicated to the promotion of social sciences and the arts.

Ana Grondona holds a degree in Sociology and a PhD. In Social Sciences, both obtained at the UBA. Her dissertation analysed the different ways in which unemployed populations were governed in Argentina from 1890 until 2006. As a postdoc she focused on the problematization of the "underclass" in Argentinean expert discourse from 1956 to 2006. Her current interests include theoretical questions around the production and circulation of expert knowledge and discourse in the peripheries and the intellectual history of "modernization" and "development" in Latin America.

In 2014 she published "Saber de la pobreza. Discursos expertos y subclases en la Argentina entre 1956 y 2006" and in 2016 "Gino Germani y América Latina. Transición, paradojas, sustituciones y heterogeneidades". Also in 2016 she coordinated the edition of "Estilos de desarrollo y buen vivir".
